ELY 16.8 miles \implies 26 mins CATHEDRAL

Ely Cathedral showcases four stages of English medieval architecture. With its three-story elevated naves, Romanesque eastern end, and blind arcade exterior, you'll be hard pushed to find a more exquisite day out.

It takes you on a journey through the ages. Consider it your personal time machine. You'll be gutted if you don't go!

THE STAINED GLASS MUSEUM

While you're visiting <u>Ely Cathedral</u>, you should head to the mystical collection of stained glass. The exhibits span creations from medieval right to the modern day — why would you want to miss this 800-year look at the past?

Open all year round, you can explore this museum in the dead of winter or the height of summer. It's completely up to you!

OLIVER CROMWELL'S HOUSE

This aptly named location sits alongside St Mary's Church and allows you to gain a once-in-a-lifetime look at the way Oliver Cromwell and his family lived. They resided here from 1636 to 1647. Not that long but as this is one of only two Cromwell houses to stand the test of time, it's an important piece of history. You'll start in the parlour, move into the kitchen, and then find yourself in the portrait room. History buffs — you can't miss this!





PRICKWILLOW 18.4 miles ENGINE MUSEUM

The <u>Prickwillow Engine Museum</u> spills the story of the drainage/pumping stations in the Fens. Situated in the historic pumping station 4 miles east of the city, history buffs will be thrilled to see the collection of massive diesel pumping engines.

BABYLON ARTS



AMERICAN CEMETERY AND

MEMORIAL

Donated by the University of Cambridge, the 30.5acre memorial and cemetery lies on a slope lined with woodland. Most of those who lay to rest here died in the Battle of the Atlantic or in the air bombardment of northwest Europe. There are 3,811 remains and 5,127 names engraved on the Walls of the Missing who were never found. It certainly makes for a solemn yet awe-inducing visit. Just remember to leave nothing but footprints.

CORPUS CLOCK

Admired since 2008, the <u>Corpus Clock</u> is the most iconic of Cambridge monuments. The face is entirely constructed from pure gold and the ever-growing ripples represent the Big Bang. On top of the clock sits the "Chronophage", a time eating monster. Each minute is "eaten" by the Chronophage and signified by a snapping of its jaws. If you're already going to Cambridge, take a detour pass the clock. You won't regret it.





GRAND 33.6 miles ARCADE


CAMBRIDGE ARTS THEATRE


Your ghost-hunter guide will lead you on an adventure through the city's most haunted parts.

Wroxham Miniature Worlds is the <u>largest indoor</u> <u>modelling attraction</u> in the United Kingdom. With over 10,000 square feet of model worlds to view, it makes for an interesting day out.

The site is split up into zones including an entire Lego city, multiple railways, train simulators, flight simulators, a vintage arcade, drivable mini railways, and so much more!



THE NORFOLK 56.9 miles BROADS

1 hr 15 mins

Built by man, the <u>Norfolk Broads</u> is a protected national park. It boasts over 125 miles of lock-free water lined by gorgeous villages, attractive towns, and rolling countryside.

If you're lucky, you may even spot some of the rarest animals and plants in the United Kingdom.

AMAZONA ZOO

BANHAM ZOO



MOUSEHOLD HEATH

Protected by the Mousehold Conservators, the Heath is a stunning 184-acre woodland, heathland, and recreational green sat in the north side of Norwich. It has earned many awards for its prestigious wildlife and conservation efforts. It's the place to unwind from the bustling life in the heart of the city.
